Chrysanthemum 'Yellow Quill' Without pinching, pruning or deadheading, this plant will mature to a nicely mounded form, completely coated in fall color. By year 3, the plant will grow up to 3.5 feet tall and up to 5 feet wide. As a perennial, it's great for lasting structure in the garden and dependable color after the big summer show is through. Yellow Quill's flower form is unique too! The yellow petals are unusually fluted, some with a little spoon-shaped tip. Attracts butterflies, not deer.	Chrysanthemum x morifolium	4
Clustered Bellflower 'Caroline' This campanula (little bell in Latin) has soft lavender to amethyst-pink flowers with a dark purple eye. Gas Plant 'Rubra' Rubra Gas Plant has masses of beautiful spikes of lightly-scented shell pink flowers with white overtones and hot pink veins rising above the foliage in early summer, which emerge from distinctive hot pink flower buds, and which are most effective when planted in groupings. Globe Thistle Globe thistle is a fast-growing, contemporary-looking flower with old-world qualities: Its spherical blue blooms are arresting in the summer border, but unlike some eye-catching flowers, globe thistle plants are drought tolerant, deer resistant, and an important source of nectar for butterflies and bees. While repellent to nibbling rabbits and deer, the spiny, spiky foliage also serves an important niche in the wildlife garden by providing food as a host plant for painted lady butterflies. In the fall, when the blooming time is over, globe thistles continue to provide textural interest with their attractive seed heads.	Echinops ritro	3

<p>Pale purple Coneflower</p> <p>This is a coarse, hairy perennial of prairies. It features narrow, parallel-veined, toothless, dark green leaves (4-10" long) and large, daisy-like flowers with drooping, pale pinkish-purple petals (ray flowers) and spiny, knob-like, coppery-orange center cones. Flowers appear on rigid stems to 2-3' (less frequently to 4') tall over a long summer bloom. This species is distinguished by (a) thin, extremely-reflexed rays which almost droop straight down and (b) very narrow, parallel-veined leaves which have no teeth. Best flower display is in late June to late July, with sporadic continued bloom into autumn.</p>	Echinacea pallida	1

<p>Purple Coneflower 'Ruby Star'</p> <p>This plant is a slightly shorter plant with large flat topped flowers that are a deeper purple pink, almost ruby red, than most others. Plants are easy to grow, tough, and heat and drought tolerant once established.</p>	Echinacea purpurea	2

<p>Resurrection Lily</p> <p>This is a late summer-blooming bulb of the Amaryllis family. Strap-like grayish-green leaves (to 12" long and 1" wide) in spring. Leaves die back in summer. Thick naked flower scapes rise to 2' tall in late summer, each bearing 4-7 funnel-shaped, rose-pink tinged with lilac flowers that are quite fragrant. Plants are sometimes commonly called resurrection flower, surprise lily or magic lily because the leaves disappear in summer with the flower spikes seemingly rising from the dead in late summer.</p>	Lycoris squamigera	7

Sweet Black Eyed Susan Sweet Black Eyed Susan is a long-lived perennial. This deep rooted Rubeckia grows at the base to form large clumps with strong multiple stems that may also branch at the top, resulting in an impressive floral display. The numerous blooms are larger than other rudbeckias, and persist for many weeks from late summer into fall. The plant has a pleasant sweet smell when blooming, similar to Sweet Grass, and many pollinators frequent the flowers. Sweet Black Eyed Susan retains its luxuriant deep green foliage and bright yellow flowers in the intense heat of summer when others may wilt. <p>Yellow Coneflower Yellow Coneflower is native to dry prairies and savannas. It has stiff and rough-feeling coarse leaves, and showy yellow flowers which have droopy soft yellow rays. The cone-like green centers eventually change to a dark purple or brown. Many insects are attracted to this plant such as butterflies and bees. It grows and transplants very easily, is drought-tolerant, and makes an excellent cut flower. Yellow Coneflower grows best in full sun to partial shade, and medium to dry-medium soil conditions.
